NOTICE – COVID-19 UPDATE

It is with great sadness to inform you of the passing of a tribal member due to underlying health conditions but who had also tested positive for COVID-19. We send our prayers and condolences to the family for their loss. This is a sad time for our community.

Let us take this time to remind ourselves of the dangers of COVID 19 virus. The number of COVID cases are reaching all-time highs all around us and the number of positive COVID cases at the Pueblo has increased to 12. We must continue to take all of the safety precautions seriously in order to protect our families and community. It is up to all of us to protect each other and limit the spread of COVID cases in the Pueblo.

Although we have asked you comply with all Pueblo orders and protocols for COVID, please, please take the following advice to heart:

Limit family and social gatherings as much as possible or don't have at all. This is difficult to do especially with the Thanksgiving holiday and students returning on break and we all want to be with our family and friends. But social gatherings are one of the main ways COVID is spreading.

- Please limit gatherings to just your household members if possible. Anytime you are around people who don't live in your household, even if they are your immediate family members, you risk exposing yourself and those family members to the virus.
- Think about wearing a mask, even inside, while you are around people who aren't in your household, and removing only when eating. Keep as much physical distancing between people as possible.
- The limit for gatherings has been reduced to **no more than 5 people**. This doesn't apply to households with more than 5 people in the home.
- This is not the time for big gatherings or parties. The Pueblo has authorized BIA and Pojoaque police to enforce the gathering limits.

Stay home as much as possible. Limit the number of trips away from home and outside of the Pueblo to only trips that are necessary for work, school, health and well-being. The more often you leave your home, you increase your chances of being exposed to the virus and risk exposing your family and others as well. If you feel sick, please stay at home. If you need to self-quarantine


or isolate and you need assistance because you can't leave home, please call Thelma Gonzales, Community Health Representative at (505) 690-1024 or Darren Stand, Tribal Administrator at (505) 455-2273, Ext. 118 or at (505) 695-5388.

Take precautions with family from out-of-state. People who haven't been in your household for a while, even if they are your children, all have the potential to bring the virus in. The MODIFIED COVID-19 REPORTING AND SELF-QUARANTINE PROTOCOL requires that any person (visitor, family or tribal member) from out-of-state who comes onto the Pueblo must self-quarantine for either 14 days or the length of their stay at the Pueblo, whichever is shorter.

Self-quarantine means the person must remain at one place to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms and cannot be out and around the Pueblo visiting with other members of the Pueblo during that time. For example, if someone comes in for a weekend, they must stay at one place for that whole time and cannot be out in the Pueblo visiting during that time. Then anyone who allows a person or tribal member from out-of-state to stay at their household is required to stay at home (self-quarantine) to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms for 14 days from the date of the last contact with the out-of-state person. These are just the precautions we all will need to take.

According to public health officials, these next few weeks will be difficult and COVID cases will increase if serious mitigation efforts aren't taken. We all need to take responsibility to do what we can to keep our Pueblo from experiencing the same kind of increase in COVID cases. Please continue to follow the Pueblo's Public Health Orders and take all safety precautions by wearing a mask, maintaining physical distancing, washing your hands often, limiting gatherings and staying home.

MODIFIED STAY-AT-HOME ORDER, CLOSURE OF PUEBLO TO NON-RESIDENTS AND CURFEW

On March 20, 2020, Governor Martinez issued an Executive Order declaring a State of Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. To protect the health and safety of the Pueblo's residents and reduce the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the Governor, in consultation and coordination with Lt. Governor Moquino and Council Representatives, issued a Stay-At-Home Order for all Pueblo residents and a Pueblo Closure to all non-residents on April 17, 2020. After considering the changing COVID-19 conditions, it is in the best interest of the Pueblo to modify the Stay-At-Home Order, Closure of Pueblo to Non-Residents and Curfew. This MODIFIED STAY-AT-HOME ORDER, CLOSURE OF PUEBLO TO NON-RESIDENTS AND CURFEW will be effective November 23, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. and will remain in effect until further notice. This Modified Order and Closure will be adjusted as needed to meet the Pueblo's public health and safety needs.

STAY-AT-HOME ORDER

1. All Pueblo residents (tribal members and non-member residents) living on Pueblo lands should remain in their home and yard area except for the most essential travel activities necessary for their health, safety or welfare.
2. Pueblo residents who travel outside of the Pueblo for any reason are expected to practice physical distancing and follow good health safety practices such as hand-washing or using hand sanitizer, wearing a face covering or mask, and sanitizing high touch areas such as cell phones, keys, steering wheels, etc. Remember that every time you leave the Pueblo, you put yourself, your family and your community at risk of contracting COVID-19.
3. Pueblo residents may check on or assist seniors/family/community members in need of assistance but individuals should not be visiting or gathering unnecessarily.
4. **No indoor gatherings of more than 5 people are allowed.** This does not apply to households with 5 or more people that live in the home.
5. Outdoor activities are encouraged to help with the physical and mental wellbeing of Pueblo residents provided that time outdoors is limited to what is necessary for those activities, you practice physical distancing by staying at least 6 feet apart from other people, and follow safety practices (hand washing, wear a mask or face covering.) **Outdoor gatherings are limited to no more than 5 people, except in the case of funerals which is limited to no more than 30 individuals**, provided they follow 6 feet social distancing requirements and wear masks. The 5 person outdoor gathering limit does not apply to households with more than 5 people who live in the home.

6. Tribal residents are allowed to work on their fields or tend to their livestock provided that physical distancing and safety practices are followed.
7. In-person public community events or gatherings may be allowed to proceed with Governor's prior approval based on specific determinations for physical distancing and capacity requirements;
8. The Senior Center, Church, Tewa Center, Gym, and El Rancho Hall remain temporarily closed and the Learning Center is open only by appointment to allow students to do school work or allow Pueblo residents internet access or to check out materials. Facility closures and limitations may be changed as deemed necessary and appropriate in accordance with Paragraph 7 above.
9. The Tribal Administration is open to provide services but subject to those measures deemed necessary to protect employees and Pueblo residents. Walk-in visits are discouraged and staff are available by phone. Masks are required for visitors and employees within the Tribal Administration Building unless an employee is alone in a private office.
 - a. The Facilities Department is on-call and will respond in-person to water and sewer emergencies.
 - b. The Transfer Station remains open and regular trash pickup schedule will continue.
 - c. The Governor's Office remains open to address day-to-day business; but walk-in visits are discouraged in order to protect our staff and community members. Call (505) 455-2273 with questions or if assistance is needed.
10. The Pueblo's convenience stores and gas station operations are considered as essential businesses and will remain open subject to those measures necessary to protect employees and customers.

CLOSURE OF PUEBLO AND CURFEW

1. There is a curfew from the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. No Pueblo resident is allowed to be outside of their home or traveling within the Pueblo during the curfew hours.
2. Exceptions to the curfew are for emergency medical situations or for employees traveling to or from work.
3. The Pueblo is closed to all outside visitors, tourists and non-residents, and this includes non-tribal member family from other Pueblos or Tribes.
4. Exceptions to the Pueblo closure are:
 - a. San Ildefonso tribal members, regardless of where they reside.
 - b. Employees of the Pueblo or its businesses.
 - c. Non-resident essential vendors, contractors, or commercial delivery drivers. This includes essential vendors, contractors and delivery drivers providing services to tribal residents at their homes.
 - d. Non-resident customers accessing the Pueblo's convenience stores and gas stations.
 - e. Non-residents traveling through the Pueblo's lands on State Roads, BIA Public Roads and County Maintained Roads within the El Rancho area, provided they remain in the vehicles.
 - f. Individuals outside of the above categories needing to come into the Pueblo to help a Pueblo resident with things like child care, health care or other assistance. In those

types of situations, the Pueblo resident must contact the Governor's Office to get prior authorization for that person to be allowed entrance to the Pueblo. The Pueblo resident requesting access authorization will be responsible for the actions of that person while on the Pueblo.

5. No arts & crafts or food vendors are permitted to sell. This includes bake sales and fundraisers.

COMPLIANCE WITH TRIBAL ORDERS

All individuals, as responsible Pueblo members and residents, are encouraged to support and comply with the Pueblo's Orders, directives and protocols, including the UPDATED COVID-19 REPORTING AND SELF-QUARANTINE PROTOCOL issued on September 30, 2020, for everyone's safety and well-being. However, it is in the best interest of the community to make sure that the Pueblo orders, directives and protocols established to protect our community from COVID-19 are followed and adhered to.

As a result, the following procedures, fines and penalties are established for failure to follow an order, directive or protocol issued by the Pueblo related to COVID-19 emergency response during this State of Emergency:

A. FINES AND PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO FOLLOW PUEBLO COVID-19 ORDER, DIRECTIVE, OR PROTOCOL RELATING TO COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE

1. First Offense: Written or verbal warning.
2. Second Offense: \$50 Fine
3. Third Offense: \$100 Fine
4. Fourth Offense: Temporary Exclusion from the Pueblo for a period to be determined by the Governor, not to exceed 90 days.
5. Flagrant Violation or Aggravating Circumstances: In event of a flagrant violation or if aggravating circumstances exist, penalties and fines do not need to be issued in sequential order and may include immediate temporary exclusion from the Pueblo for a period to be determined by Governor, not to exceed 90 days.

B. AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE COVID-19 ORDERS AND DIRECTIVES AND ISSUE CITATIONS

The Governor has authorized BIA Law Enforcement and Pojoaque Pueblo Police Department officers to enforce the Pueblo's COVID-19 Orders, Directives or Protocols as necessary, including enforcement of gathering limits. BIA and Pojoaque Pueblo Police officers are authorized to direct individuals to stop or leave gatherings that exceed limits. Anyone that does not comply with a command from a law enforcement officer may be charged with disobeying a lawful order of an law enforcement officer, in addition to violation of a COVID-19 Order, Directive or Protocol. Residents are encouraged to call Pojoaque Police Dispatch for gatherings that exceed size limits.


C. PAYMENT OF FINES

Payment of fines shall be made to the Pueblo Finance Department within thirty (30) days of issuance of a citation.

- D. In addition to the above fines and penalties for failing to follow a COVID-19 related order, directive or protocol, all of the criminal sanctions under the Pueblo's laws remain in effect.

The Pueblo leadership does not take these actions lightly or without great concern for the health and well-being of our community members. We ask for your continued support, patience, commitment and understanding to do your part to help the Pueblo de San Ildefonso community to remain strong and healthy through this COVID-19 pandemic.

UPDATED COVID-19 REPORTING AND SELF-QUARANTINE PROTOCOL

On March 20, 2020, Governor Martinez issued an Executive Order declaring a State of Emergency. In connection with that Executive Order, the Governor, in consultation and coordination with the Council, issues the following protocol for reporting a positive case of COVID-19 to the Pueblo Administration as well as the protocol for other COVID-19 related situations. This protocol applies to individuals residing on Pueblo lands. This protocol is issued to protect the safety and health of Pueblo members. The protocol will be adjusted and updated as necessary.

IF YOU HAVE BEEN TESTED FOR OR BEEN CONFIRMED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19, you must report this information to Darren Stand, Tribal Administrator, immediately at (505) 455-2273, Ext 118 or (505) 695-5388. If you have been tested, you must report a positive test result as soon the test results are confirmed. Reporting information will be kept confidential to the extent allowable by law.
- You must immediately self-quarantine at home, isolate yourself from other members in your household as much as possible and follow the directives from the CDC that are attached. This includes the period while waiting for the COVID-19 test results.
 - What is Quarantine? Quarantine keeps someone who was in close contact with a person who has COVID-19 away from others. Quarantined individuals must stay home for 14 days after their last close contact and stay away from people who are at higher risk of getting very sick from COVID-19. This also means no one should be entering or leaving the home in order to minimize contact while monitoring for symptoms or waiting for test results.
 - What is Isolation? Isolation keeps someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 with or without symptoms away from others, even in their own home. In the home, anyone sick or infected should separate themselves from others by staying in a specific “sick room” or area and using a separate bathroom (if available). Take precautions when interacting with other household members including wearing masks even while in your home. The isolated person should not leave the home except for medical appointments.

UPDATED PUEBLO DE SAN ILDEFONSO COVID-19 REPORTING AND QUARANTINE PROTOCOL

- You will be contacted by the Pueblo to follow up on the status of your condition and to obtain background information. This may be by telephone. For an individual that has been instructed to self-quarantine, you will be subject to follow up calls to check on your status.
- You must provide appropriate contact information and an emergency point of contact.
- You are instructed to follow all medical directives and any further directives from the Pueblo.
- If you fail to self-quarantine for the testing period or after being tested positive for COVID-19 or fail to follow the directives issued by the Pueblo, you may be cited and subject to a fine or penalty as this not only puts your health at further risk but puts your family and your community at risk as well.
- If you are required to self-quarantine or isolate and need assistance because you cannot leave your home, contact Darren Stand, Tribal Administrator at (505) 455-2273, Ext. 118 or at (505) 695-5388 or Thelma Gonzales, Community Health Representative at (505) 690-1024.

IF YOU HAVE BEEN IN CONTACT WITH ANYONE WHO IS EXPERIENCING SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 OR HAS BEEN TESTED POSITIVE

- You must stay at home (self-quarantine) to monitor yourself for COVID-19 symptoms and avoid contact with others as much as possible for up to 14 days.
- If you have been in contact with someone who is sick or has tested positive for COVID-19, you must stay at home (self-quarantine) to monitor yourself for COVID-19 symptoms and avoid contact with others as much as possible for up to 14 days.
- You do not need to report to the Pueblo under these circumstances unless you become ill and are tested or test positive for COVID-19. At that time you are required to follow the protocol for a positive COVID-19 test described above.

IF YOU ARE FEELING SICK WITH SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19, YOU SHOULD CALL THE NEW MEXICO DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AT 1-855-600-3453 AND YOUR DOCTOR

- You should stay home (self-quarantine), follow the instructions of the New Mexico Department of Health and monitor your symptoms for up to 14 days.
- Stay in touch with your doctor. Call before you leave your home to get medical care. Be sure to get care if you feel worse or you think it is an emergency. If you have questions or concerns about your symptoms, you should call your doctor.
- If you are tested or confirmed to have COVID-19, then follow the protocol for positive COVID-19 described above.


UPDATED PUEBLO DE SAN ILDEFONSO COVID-19 REPORTING AND QUARANTINE PROTOCOL

IF YOU HAVE TRAVELED OUT-OF-STATE IN THE LAST 14 DAYS OR HAVE PEOPLE WHO LIVE OUT-OF STATE IN YOUR HOME

- Any tribal member, Pueblo resident, or employee who works at the Pueblo, who travels outside of the State of New Mexico for any reason is required to stay at home (self-quarantine) for 14 days upon their return and monitor for COVID-19 symptoms. You should avoid contact with others as much as possible during the 14 days.
- Any visitor or person, including a tribal member, from outside the State of New Mexico who comes onto the Pueblo is required to self-quarantine for either 14 days or the length of their stay at the Pueblo, whichever is shorter, prior to making contact with any other person(s) on the Pueblo.
- Self-quarantine means the out-of-state person must remain at one location to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms and cannot be out and around the Pueblo making contact with other members of the Pueblo during that entire time.
- Any person or household member who allows a person, including tribal members, from outside of the State of New Mexico is also required to stay at home (self-quarantine) to monitor for COVID-19 symptoms for 14 days from the date of the last contact with the person.

Governor: Candidates for Governor shall be enrolled Members of the Pueblo and be at least 30 years old on the deadline date for filing candidacy. Once a candidate is sworn in as Governor, the Governor shall immediately establish residency within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo as defined at the time of the adoption of this agreement.

Council Representative: Candidates for Council Representatives shall be enrolled Members of the Pueblo, and at least 25 years old on the deadline date for filing candidacy. Once a candidate is sworn in as a Representative, the Representative shall have thirty days to establish residency within the exterior boundaries of the
